<p>Sale College is offering a 1:1 tablet / laptop program in 2021 all students. The Laptop will be purchased by the school to allow the legal installation of required software and will also include warranty and insurance. Students will have full use of the Laptop throughout the school year. Students receive a new upgraded laptop at the beginning of Years 7 and 10. Due to a price increase in the laptops, the laptop hire fee will be increased to \$250. This will occur as the students reach Year 7 and Year 10.</p> <p>This fee will cover the lease of the Laptop as well as technical support. \$50 of which is a compulsory insurance.</p>
