COMPUTER HIRE

Sale College is offering a 1:1 tablet / laptop program in 2019 all students. The Tablet / Laptop will be purchased by the school to allow the legal installation of required software and will also include warranty and insurance. Students will have full use of the Tablet / Laptop throughout the school year and will be charged \$200 per student per year. \$50 of this cost is a compulsory insurance. This fee will cover the lease of the Tablet / Laptop as well as technical support.

PARENT FUNDED MATERIALS & SERVICES

Some elective units Year 9 to 12 are deemed high cost and parents are expected to pay for those. See Parent Voluntary Contributions and School Charges as listed below as the guidelines from the *Department of Education, Employment and Training*.

Part A: Parents are expected to provide or pay the school to provide the following materials/services.	
School uniform (where applicable) Student textbooks including hire or access to class sets of text books and print/resource material in lieu of text books. Student requisites/stationery. Material for programs/electives, where: The student consumes or takes possession of the finished articles eg Technology The payment sought is the difference between the basic materials/services and higher cost alternative.	Student computer printing above basic requirements. Programs provided by outside specialists (eg visiting artists/speakers). Official diary/handbook/workplanner. Camps/excursions which are integral to the curriculum and that all students are expected to attend. School identification cards. Locker charge. Entry fees to community facilities eg swimming pool, art gallery, etc
Part B: Schools may offer a range of optional materials/services for which parents are expected to pay if they wish their children to receive them. Common examples of optional services are as follows:	
Graduation dinners or presentation, debutante balls. Before and after school/holiday child care. School magazine. Class/individual photographs. Religious instruction materials. Student accident insurance. Canteen services. School concerts, performances and productions.	Internet access for recreational or non-school use. Camps/excursions that are optional. Hire/lease fees including: music instruments, notebook computers. Extra curricular programs eg private instrumental music tuition.
