



## Sale College Awards System

The awards system enables the school to recognise students for their commitment, involvement and excellence to the school in a range of areas. At Sale College participation in the many areas of school life is encouraged and valued and these activities are embedded in the life of the school. Participation in school life contributes to our student's individual growth and development and builds the school community. The school is proud that our students have such a wide variety of interests and pursuits and will continue to support them in their fields of endeavour.

The purpose of the Awards system is to recognise students for their commitment, involvement and excellence to the school in the following areas: Academic, Sports, Civics and Citizenship and the Arts.

Once students accumulate a certain number of points, they will be awarded with their merit badge.



This is structured to allow students the potential to achieve an award badge at the conclusion of each term, final award recognitions are all presented at the end of year Awards Day Presentation.

The points accumulated will be re-set at the start of each school year.



The following is to be used as a guide when appointing students awards points on Compass under each of the recognised areas. Each section will be embedded into Compass under its respective category for easy access to refer to when recognising student's commitments and achievements

### **Academic**

Based on consistent performance based on effort, behaviour and work quality

\*\*\* academic points are to be generated based on GPAs therefore, no category is allocated on Compass

### **Civics and Citizenship**

*How to earn points*

- Fundraisers (based on how much effort was put in)
- Volunteering (inside and out of school)
- VCAL projects (Should have an aim to improve the school community)
- School improvement projects (as above, e.g. garden bed rejuvenation, painting)
- Canteen helpers
- Promoting the school at community events (e.g. ANZAC Day, Remembrance Day, Youth Parliament, Youth Council)
- Student Voice
- Teachers can award points in the yard for those displaying clear leadership

*Weighting of points*

- 10 points per hour
- Helping to set up social event – 20 points total
- More points to be awarded for outside of school participation (extra 15 on top of 10p/h)

### **Arts**

*Music*

- Eisteddfod: 10 points per performance
  - 1<sup>st</sup> place = +15 points
  - 2<sup>nd</sup> place = +10 points
  - 3<sup>rd</sup> place = +5 points
- Self-organised: 30 points extra

*Performing*

- 20 points per show
- 10 points per rehearsal

*Visual*

- Exhibitions: 10 points per entry piece
  - 1<sup>st</sup> place = +15 points
  - 2<sup>nd</sup> place = +10 points
  - 3<sup>rd</sup> place = +5 points
- Self-organised: 30 points extra

### **Sport**

*How to earn points*

- Points awarded per event and ranking – not time spent
- 10 points per event participated in



- Next level/round = more points
  - 10 points for participation, double placing points

#### *Weighting of points*

#### X Country

- 10 points for participating
  - Top 20 runners get an additional 10 points

#### Athletics

- 10 points per event
  - 1<sup>st</sup> place = +15 points
  - 2<sup>nd</sup> place = +10 points
  - 3<sup>rd</sup> place = +5 points

#### Swimming

- 10 points per event
  - 1<sup>st</sup> place = +15 points
  - 2<sup>nd</sup> place = +10 points
  - 3<sup>rd</sup> place = +5 points
- Points awarded for novelty events (5 points)

#### School Sports

- 10 points per event
- Next level/round = more points
  - 10 points for participation, double placing points (progression to next round)
